The Bathurst Regional Council Local Government Area encompasses part of the Traditional Lands of the Wiradjuri people.


The Wiradjuri people are the people of the three rivers, the Wambool (Macquarie), the Calare/ Kalari (Lachlan), and the Murrumbidgee.



# Bathurst & VILLAGES

As you explore Bathurst & surrounding Villages, you'll discover why so many artists have been captivated by the landscape of the Central Tablelands.

## » Bathurst

With settlement spanning back to before the Gold Rush era and a rich Aboriginal history before that, you may be surprised to find that Bathurst is as culturally fascinating now as it ever was. Bathurst is also of course a university town, with **Charles Sturt Uni** helping to keep this historic city relevant and moving forward with edgy optimism and youthful exuberance.

## » Hill End

Once a booming gold town, Hill End today is a blend of heritage buildings and mine relics. The town is also known for being an artistic hub - Brett Whiteley, John Olsen, Donald Friend and Russell Drysdale all found themselves inspired by the village's historic charm and landscapes in the 60s and 70s and an Artist In Residence program run by **Bathurst Regional Art Gallery** keeps the artistic energy alive and well in the town today.

## » Sofala

One of the most captivating and unusual gold mining town in New South Wales, Sofala, a 40-minute drive north of Bathurst, is a two-

street village with an authentic old-world charm captured perfectly by famous Australian artist, Russell Drysdale, in his iconic 1947 award-winning painting of the same name. While the gold rush may be long over, gold panning still takes place in the Turon River today as part of guided tours.

## » Wattle Flat

When travelling north towards Sofala or Hill End, the beautiful country village of Wattle Flat is a perfect place to plan a stop. The impressive stone buildings stand as a memory of when up to 40,000 called the town home at the height of the gold rush.

## » Peel

Don't rush the scenic drive from Bathurst to the gold towns of Sofala and Hill End, as every village has its own story to tell. The countryside around Peel was once fiercely contested between warriors of the Wiradjuri people and European settlers, with the grave of the great Wiradjuri leader Windradyne on the Brucedale property at Peel.

## » Peel

Take the road less travelled between Bathurst and Lithgow or

Mudgee and you may pass through the quiet retreat of Sunny Corner, a town which has attracted artists, potters and craftspeople in recent years, and was once the site of the largest silver mine in Australia prior to Broken Hill.

## » Sunny Corner

Less than half an hour east of Bathurst, set just off the Great Western Highway, is the old village of Yetholme. At 1,180 metres above sea level, Yetholme is one of the highest points in the region with snow often transforming the village into an Instagrammer's dream during the winter months.

## » Yetholme

## » O'Connell

O'Connell makes a lovely day trip for foodies and history buffs alike. Located an easy 20 minute drive from Bathurst's town centre, you'll know you've reached this charming town when you drive under the leafy canopy of Desert Ash trees, planted to commemorate locals who fought and lost their lives in World War I.

## » Perthville

This charming little town 20-minutes south of Bathurst makes a nice stop on your way to **Vale Creek Wines**, or a family day trip to experience life as a local farmer at **Barcoos**. The village is also home to **St Joseph's Convent** and the local tradition of the Josephite sisters that dates back to 1872.

## » Rockley

This immaculately preserved 19th-century country town, 30-minutes' drive south of Bathurst, is one of the oldest settlements

west of the Blue Mountains. Declared as a National Trust Historic Village, Rockley is home to over two dozen Insta-worthy heritage buildings and beautiful parklands.

You can drop into local Bathurst artist Tim Miller's beloved studio for an art class, enjoy a scrumptious high tea and end the day with a fine Italian wine en route back to Bathurst.

## » Trunkey Creek

A scenic 40 minute drive south-west of Bathurst rests the small picturesque village of Trunkey Creek in one of the earliest pastoral areas in the Bathurst region with some sections being surveyed and settled as early as the 1820s.

The discovery of large quartz reefs in the late 1860s led to a gold rush in and around the town, but it was wool that has provided a more enduring source of prosperity with some of Australia's finest quality merino wool still produced here. Drop into the **Black Stump Hotel** or original 1879 general store before striking out to explore the many nearby natural attractions.

## » Tarana

Nestled in the picturesque valleys of the Central West, a 40-minute drive east of Bathurst, Tarana is a treat for outdoor adventurers who love hiking, rock climbing and nature. Explore amongst the granite tors of **Evans Crown**, before treating yourself at the famous 1873 **Tarana Hotel**.

# Village EVENTS

The picturesque historic villages of the Bathurst region come alive throughout the year with a series of activities and events. From arts and music festivals to historical re-enactments and the grand tradition of the country show, these are a very special part of the annual calendar for locals and visitors alike. Although 2020 was a difficult year for the region's events, plans are in place to bring back many of the most iconic village events in 2021! As always, make sure you check the website for the most up to date information on all events.

## » Tarana Community Farmer's Markets

Put the **fourth Sunday of every month** in the diary for a trip to Tarana where the region's best produce is on display. Fill your basket with items direct from local farms and kitchens with over 50 stalls every month. Meet the farmers, listen to the buskers and enjoy a great coffee all in the beautiful Tarana valley.



# THE MOUNTAIN, THE RACE, *The Legend*



Mount Panorama, known for thousands of years as Wahluu to the Wiradjuri people, looms large over Bathurst. Once also called "The Bald Hills" by locals in the early 20th century, the site is now internationally famous and one of Australia's most instantly recognisable icons.

Beginning as plans for a 'scenic drive' in the Depression years of the 1930s, the Mount Panorama Racing Circuit has been challenging drivers and riders for over 80 years. 6.213km in length, the track has 23 corners and some of the steepest gradients of any track in the world with a 174 vertical difference between the highest and lowest points.

The technical challenges of the track combine with the picturesque setting and the sense of history and tradition that permeates every event to create something truly unique.

To many visitors, Mount Panorama is a destination but to many more it is a pilgrimage! There are five major motor racing events on the track annually; the epic Bathurst 1000 in October, the internationally recognised 12 Hour in February, the 6 Hour at Easter, the 'Challenge' of late November and the brand-new Bathurst International.

Each event has its own distinctive character and following. Unfortunately, COVID-19 restrictions have forced the cancellation of the 12 Hour for 2021.

In some ways, the nature of the events on Mount Panorama encapsulates the spirit of the Bathurst region as the Great Race is a celebration of skill and perseverance, but also of innovation and reinvention with new technology always a factor in success.



With the fastest official lap of the Mount recorded in 2018 (1.59.291 set on 16 November 2018 by Christopher Mies during the 2018 Challenge Bathurst driving a GT3-spec Audi R8 Ultra) it is certain that the future will see the competitors continue to push new limits at this, the spiritual home of Australian motor racing.

## BEYOND Mount Panorama

Bathurst's Mount Panorama is famous in Australia and around the world for being home to the annual Repco Bathurst 1000 car race. The fame of this thrilling spectacle is well deserved, and it is easily the largest single annual event in regional NSW! However, the appeal of the mountain goes far beyond the squeal of tyres and smell of burning rubber.

### » Drive the Famous Track

The road around Mount Panorama is first and foremost a scenic drive. It's a public road and anyone can take a drive around the track looking out over the Bathurst tablelands. You don't need any special permission – you can take a leisurely drive around the track at any time outside of race periods. Make sure that you first download the 'Bathurst - Step Beyond' App featuring "A Lap with Craig Lowndes". Let Craig be your personal guide to the history and happenings of this Australian icon as you do your own lap! Get it for FREE now on the Apple Store or Google Play.

### » The Boardwalk Experience

Take in the best views in the region from the top of Wahluu/Mount Panorama as you stroll along the new boardwalk, opened in late 2020. Best experienced by parking at the John Hinxman Vista Lookout and then proceeding on foot, the Boardwalk experience is still being developed to include elements that tell the stories of the long Wiradjuri connection to this place, the story of the development of the landscape and the most recent development of the site into the icon of Australian motor racing.

### » Panorama Punish

**31 OCTOBER 2021**

Prefer to do a lap of the mountain on your own steam? The Panorama Punish is 'one hot lap' of the 6.2km circuit – gaining 174 metres in elevation as you go. Sound like a piece of cake? It's actually more than double the height of the Sydney Opera House. Dust off your runners and start training now as there are strictly enforced runner cut-off times. You'll need to be fit enough to get through the first 3kms in half an hour. Caveat? The first half is all uphill. Entry is limited to 1,000 participants, so get in quick to register. All proceeds go to local charities.

### » Mount Panorama Estate Vineyard

### History and Heritage

Just walking around the city of Bathurst or its regional villages is like stepping back in time. With the courthouse as its centrepiece, the surrounding Kings Parade and Machattie park provide a delightful opportunity to wander about in historic parklands. The clever design of the city's street layout goes back over two centuries to the time when Bathurst was proclaimed as Australia's first inland settlement. As you walk around the wide streets there is plenty of evidence of the original colonial buildings. When you leave the city, the surrounding villages all have their own individual history, curiosity and charm.

### Museums

Bathurst has numerous museums within the city and in the surrounding villages and they all have their special delights for children, who should be encouraged to bring along their parents.

### Bathurst Railway Station and Milltown

The historic, heritage listed railway station, which was commissioned in 1876, is one of the finest in the state and is maintained in its original splendour. Once the rail line was established, mills soon followed and this region became a centre for flour milling. Now decommissioned, the buildings that housed two of these mills still remain as Crago Mill and Tremain's Mill.

### Lower Keppel Street and Tremain's Mill

A short walk from the station and you will find yourself outside 'The Victoria', a recently restored pub which specialises in quality 'pub grub' and musical events. A few steps further and you will see the Tremain's Mill complex. The open courtyard has been paved and grassed to provide a new and extremely popular morning and lunchtime venue for dining and coffee devotees. There is a French bakery and an outstanding coffee shop on site. And there's a lot more to come!

The **Tablelands Artists Co-operative Gallery (T.Arts)** is an exceptional not-for-profit and artist-run showcase of the exceptional creative talents of the Bathurst region's artists located on George St (just down from **Annie's Ice Cream**). And for a detailed history of motor racing, complete with racing memorabilia and famous race cars, the **National Motor Racing Museum** at the bottom of Mount Panorama is unmissable. Want more? **Ash's Speedway Museum** is the largest collection of Speedway memorabilia in the Southern Hemisphere and will amaze both die-hard fans and casual visitors with its sheer size and diversity!

An incredibly exciting addition in 2020 was the long-awaited opening of the **Bathurst Rail Museum** adjacent to the railway station in Havannah Street which explores the stories of the Bathurst community's close connection to rail history including that of legendary Bathurst local and Prime Minister, Ben Chifley.

# GET Outdoors

Long famed as 'the city of the plains', Bathurst sits at the centre of one of the most beautiful and diverse natural landscapes in NSW.

The city itself is renowned for its beautiful parks and gardens with **Kings Parade** and **Machattie Park** in the heart of town delighting locals and visitors for generations and the **Bathurst Adventure Playground** a great favourite with families. And you don't need to go far to get back to nature, with the box gum grassy woodland and resident kangaroos of **Boundary Road Reserve** only 5 minutes from the CBD. Step beyond the city boundaries and a world of adventure awaits with ancient limestone cave systems, granite tors, forests and the meandering rivers of the Macquarie, Turon, Campbell and Fish. Try your luck at gold panning in waters that once drew thousands to the area from the 1850s.

There are outstanding 4WD tracks (and knowledgeable local operators who know all the best spots) and a number of walking tracks that take you through the region's nature reserves.

Camping and four wheel driving is extremely popular in the Bathurst region, with a number of popular free camps along **The Bridle Track**, as well as some lesser known picturesque places along the Turon River at Sofala, and **Flat Rock** along the Fish River.

For a great day trip, pack a picnic and your swimmers to cool off in the river on a hot day. Most of the popular spots are accessible by 2WD vehicles. Bathurst Visitor Information Centre has plenty of information on the best local camping spots and water holes, contact us to find out more.

**Whether you're an active or passive outdoor adventurer, there is so much to see, do and explore in the great outdoors of the Bathurst region.**

Bathurst is the gateway site for the exciting new **Inland Astro Trail** which is set to link over 40 astronomical observatories and sites of astronomical significance including First Nations sites across the NSW Central West and Inland regions. Leave the lights of the city behind and be amazed by the steadily darkening sky and the incredible profusion of the southern hemisphere stars. Challenge yourself to take the perfect astrophotographic image!

# STREETSCAPES & Landmarks

Bathurst is so full of exceptional landmarks it can be hard to know which way to look first. It is also a town with very distinctive areas, streetscapes and precincts with their own unique flavour and heritage.

One of the most unique and engaging of these is the section of **Keppel Street** which runs from William Street to the Railway Station and **Bathurst Rail Museum**. The street itself boasts a number of the state heritage listed cast iron lamp posts and lanterns in the middle of the street that are one of the great icons of Bathurst (and a challenge to unfamiliar motorists at intersections where the rule is to turn in front of the posts in a 'diamond turn' manoeuvre!).

**Keppel Street** is renowned as an artistic and cultural hub in Bathurst as well as a haven for quirky and bespoke shopping experiences. Making your way towards the Railway to the south of Bentinck Street you will discover a number of delightful old buildings, many from the late nineteenth century, that today contain boutiques, secondhand book shops and clothing stores. It is a pleasure to window shop. It is also home to the exceptional **Bathurst Regional Art Gallery**, one of the oldest and finest regional galleries in NSW and the adjoining **Bathurst Library**. The Gallery hosts a number of exhibitions annually in addition to its own collection, including both touring exhibitions and those featuring outstanding local artists.

The area from the base of Keppel Street heading to the south-west was once known as **Milltown**, centered around the railway and the flour mills of the late 1800s. Reminders of this era are everywhere from the mighty complex of **Tremain's Mill** to the humble home of Ben and Elizabeth Chifley on Busby Street. You can even stay in **The Old Milltown Police Station B&B**!

The **Bathurst Town Square**, an area bordered by William, George, Howick and Russell Streets, is the heritage heart of Bathurst. In addition to the superb buildings that line the streets, the area is a genuine town square in practice where citizens of Bathurst as well as visitors gather to celebrate and commemorate, whether at ANZAC Day before the **War Memorial Carillon Tower** or over the fortnight of the annual **Winter Festival** when illuminations transform the area and neighbouring **Machattie Park**. No visit to Bathurst can be complete without experiencing the Town Square, the stories of which are narrated on the free **Bathurst Step Beyond App** – the perfect guide to your exploration.

The European built heritage of Bathurst is evident everywhere, but perhaps nowhere more visibly than to the 20,000 vehicles a day on the Great Western Highway that pass by the landmark of the **Bathurst Showground** which has been welcoming travellers to

Bathurst with its extensive grounds and magnificent buildings for over 140 years.

The showground has been used continuously since 1878, which makes it one of the earliest in NSW. A number of the beautiful Pavilions are the original buildings and exude a rare old-world charm. The **Beau Brown Pavilion** was originally relocated from Ashfield Recreation Ground, where it had been used as a skating rink. The **Moxon Grandstand** building kept it company and was also relocated to Bathurst in 1892.

There are so many quirky and captivating facts surrounding the history of the Showground. The first aeroplane flight west of the Blue Mountains took off and landed here in 1912, the site was a recruiting ground and military camp during The Great War, it has been used for motorbikes and harness racing (before completion of Bathurst's **Harness Racing Club**) and Queen Elizabeth II has even visited!

Today the Bathurst Showground is enjoying a huge revival of interest with a wonderful and varied calendar of events including the **Farmer's Markets**, travelling shows and displays, the Lifeline Book Fairs and, of course, **The Royal Bathurst Show** which is recognised as second only to Sydney in regards to its importance and size. The Showground is an increasingly popular site for camping and caravanners and you can even have your wedding, graduation or special function within these heritage buildings.

A town and region that proudly preserves its heritage, Bathurst is the perfect mix of old and new. And not just beautiful buildings to admire from the outside! In Bathurst you can eat in heritage buildings, stay in beautifully restored 19th century establishments and explore the region's past with a series of heritage events throughout the year.

Legendary Australian prime minister Ben Chifley was born in Bathurst in 1885. The story of Ben Chifley is one of the features of the **Bathurst Rail Museum**, a brand-new part of the Bathurst heritage story part housed in the historic Railway Institute Building. Years in the planning, this museum tells the social history of the railway and how it opened up NSW through immersive displays and experiences that will captivate die hard rail enthusiasts, fans of heritage and their children!

But that's not all, there is also **Abercrombie House** the impressive Scottish Baronial mansion from the 1870s, the well-preserved history of the nearby village of Hill End and its gold mining past, a restored Cobb and Co Coach in the **Bathurst Visitor Information Centre**, and bushranger stories you can hear in town on the **Step Beyond App** as you walk through the myriad of old buildings and laneways. Or explore the **Bathurst Showground**.

Rich history is everywhere here, all you really need to do is look and listen. Restaurants are housed in buildings that were once Church schoolhouses or the town's post office; lanes are named after gangs of bush rangers who were captured and hanged for robbing townsfolk.

And then there is the beauty of the city's Victorian park, the gorgeous **Machattie Park**, with its bandstand, a begonia house and a delightful fountain, all remnants from a bygone era. Bathurst is an exciting mix borne of a spectacular history that really has to be seen and experienced to be believed.

**Bathurst is in Wiradjuri country with a cultural heritage that extends back over 40,000 years. It is also famed as Australia's oldest inland European settlement having been established in 1815. Rich history is everywhere here.**

The heritage of the region comes truly alive throughout the year with a number of events including the popular **Heritage Trades Trail** whilst the annual 'Autumn Colours Heritage Tours' offer the opportunity to get behind the scenes of some of Bathurst's most intriguing places.



### Wines



Old Government Cottage, believed to be the oldest building in town is a delightful brick cottage in a colonial cottage garden, the Victorian Courthouse designed by Thomas Barnett, the Colonial architect of the time is a wonderful imposing building with magnificent copper dome.





## Abercrombie House

## The Australian Fossil and Mineral Museum

It is wonderful that such a world class collection of minerals and fossils is located in Bathurst. It is highly worth a visit as it is incredible just how beautiful nature can be. It is just one of a number of great museums in Bathurst.

## Fine Dining and Wineries

There is such a wonderful mix of dining experience, many offering our regions wines. If not, a tour of the region and visiting the wineries in person is always high on the list for many of my visitors.

## Abercrombie Caves

Well worth the drive to spend some time in nature and wonder at the caves. I love how Abercrombie is less crowded than other caves and certainly a hidden wonder of NSW.

Bathurst and the Central Tablelands is host to some of the best skies for stargazers in the world. With a range of astronomical experiences, Bathurst is the gateway to exploring what the wider region has to offer. You can experience the wonder of the sky from the numerous parks and camping areas around town or plan a visit to the **Bathurst Observatory**, to marvel at objects through their large research telescope under dark rural skies.

Bathurst is a prime observing site, and host to a range of private and public observatories including **Grove Creek Observatory** near Trunkey Creek (catering to professional observers), and **Bathurst Observatory** at Billywillinga, close to town offering general public tours. The number of astronomers in the area is a testament to the clear skies of the region. The rich star fields of the southern skies are envied by those in the northern hemisphere for being clear of light and air pollution, enabling the rich regions of the Milky Way to be seen at their best. Bathurst also has the advantage of being only a short trip from Sydney and has a range of other attractions to offer the amateur and professional gazer alike. You can explore the region by day and the vastness of space above by night.

From our vantage point you can see distant galaxies, star clusters and planets and dive deep into the heart of our own galaxy. At the **Bathurst Observatory** you may try your skills at astrophotography, gaze at distant worlds and see star-forming regions close up. There is nothing more engaging than feeling your connection to space under a myriad of stars. These connections are not modern, but stretch back through thousands of years of Aboriginal people who saw the stars as having rich links to their culture.

The Observatory caters for all levels of astronomical knowledge, and is particularly known for its work with comets, asteroids and, in particular, study of meteorites as well as organising pop-up stargazing events at other dark sky suitable venues including Abercrombie House.



# Epic Road Trips & TOURING ROUTES

The great tradition of the Aussie road trip is well and truly back, and a good thing too!

When travelling, the journey itself should be as important and as enjoyable as the ultimate destination. Or perhaps there is no 'destination', you are travelling for the sheer pleasure of changing horizons and the unexpected by the side of the road. What about the weekend short break or even the Sunday drive? Well, if the memory is hazy then it is time to rediscover the pleasure of touring by road.

The Central Tablelands of NSW is a sensational region to explore by car. With Bathurst less than three hours drive from Sydney and scarcely more from Canberra it is easy to get to and to explore. You will be driving across landscapes shaped by long vanished volcanoes or formed on

ancient seabeds, and walked by Aboriginal people for many thousands of years before the crossing of the Blue Mountains by Europeans in 1813 opened the region up for settlement. There can be a sense that you are connecting elements of a Gondwanan past, from visiting caves that are amongst the world's oldest to one of the most exceptional Devonian fossil sites on Earth.

It is a region of historic villages, of distant horizons and a mix of remnant woodlands and the now iconic landscapes of Australian agriculture. Whether you are hoping to travel on good sealed roads, or looking to get off the beaten track there are a myriad of options and none that should be rushed. In the same vein as the slow food movement, a modern road trip is a form of slow travel - discovering a region in


bite sized pieces and savouring the ever-changing perspective.

It is also a region that is moving with the times. A network of electric vehicle charging stations has sprung up across the Central West in recent years. # Friendship



CIRENCESTER, HOME OF THE EARL OF BATHURST



Bathurst was named in 1815 for the 3rd Earl of Bathurst whose ancestral home is at Cirencester, the largest city of the Cotswolds district of Gloucestershire in the UK.

Originally known as **Corinium Dobunnorum**, the city was once the second largest town in Roman Britain and a centre for the medieval wool trade. Today the 9th Earl Bathurst still resides at the family seat of Cirencester Park, with the town now a flourishing regional centre of over 18,000 and an important hub to the surrounding villages.

In 2016 Bathurst NSW and Cirencester began to establish a closer relationship based upon their historical ties and economic similarities between the regions. In 2019 a formal friendship arrangement was formalised between the two cities.

Having established this formal friendship arrangement, both cities shared a desire to move beyond a symbolic relationship and to create a genuine economic partnership to benefit the local businesses and economies of both areas. The first stage in this process was the establishment of the 'Cotswolds Store' at the Bathurst Visitor Information Centre in October 2019. The Store stocks a selection of authentic products of Cirencester and the Cotswolds, all carefully selected and personally approved by Lord Bathurst.

The Store and Friendship Agreement will lead to even closer connections, with a number of visits between the two regions also planned for the year ahead.
