


Trunkey Creek Showground

Bridle Track Campsites

The Bridle Track was the first road developed between Bathurst and Hill End during the gold rush. Following a rockslide at Monaghans Bluff in 2010, the track is not passable to its full length. However it is accessible up to Monaghans Bluff from either Bathurst or Hill End. Now mostly used as a 4WD trail, the Bridal Track has 8 marked camping sites along its full length. With 5 accessible from the Bathurst side and 3 accessible from the Hill End side.

The Diggings

The Diggings campground resides in Turon National Park, with options for tent sites and camper trailer sites. However, due to road conditions within the national park, a 4wd is advised to access the campground and greater Turon National Park. The Diggings Campground has drop toilets, and woodfire barbeques which you will need to bring your own wood for. Bookings are essential, and a \$6 booking fee applies call 1300



Woolshed Flat

On the Eastern side of Turon National Park. Woolshed Flat sits next to the river with sites for tents and camper trailers. This site is not accessible with caravans and requires a 4wd to access. This campground also features woodfire barbeques which you will need to bring your own wood for. Bookings are essential, and a \$6 booking fee applies call 1300 072 757 or visit www.nationalparks.nsw for more information.

Wattle Flat Heritage Lands North Camping area

Entrance off of Thompson St. Visit general store at 3817 Sofala Road to pay for camping.

The heritage grounds are a managed crown lands site that allows camping at a cost of \$5 per night.
